

Urban Trail System

TART Trail

The 10.5-mile long TART Trail is a paved urban transportation and recreation corridor with an eastern end point at M-72/Bates Rd in Acme Township and a western end point at Carter Rd in Traverse City, where it links with the Leelanau Trail.

Boardman Lake Trail

The heavily wooded 2-mile trail is a combination of pavement, boardwalk, and crushed limestone. The western portion of the Boardman Lake Trail between Oryana and 14th Street will be constructed in 2014.

Mall Trail

The nearly 2-mile long Mall Trail parallels US-31, connecting downtown Traverse City with many commercial businesses and restaurants, ending at the Grand Traverse Mall.

Buffalo Ridge Trail

A proposed 4.5-mile trail that connects the west and southwest areas of Traverse City. The first half-mile section is complete and provides a connection between the Grand Traverse Commons, TBA-ISD, West Middle School, the Historic Barns Park and Botanical Garden of Northwest Michigan.

Three Mile Trail

The 2-mile long trail follows Three Mile Rd from the State Park beach on US 31 to South Airport Rd. Future plans include extending the trail to Hammond Rd.

TART-In-Town

Several point-to-point on-street bike routes in Traverse City.

- Cross-Town Route is an east-west bike route from TC Central High to the Grand Traverse and Munson Medical Center.
- Rose Street Route is a north-south connector on the east side of town.
- Elmwood Street Route is a north-south connector on the west side of town.
